# Capital Campaign Progress



The campaign to raise funds for the new <u>Outpatient Diagnostic Center</u> at SVH continues to progress well. To date, **over \$17 million in funds have been raised** to upgrade key imaging equipment (CT Scanner, MRI, and X-Ray) and centrally locate it in the old surgery room area of the hospital.

Our goal is to raise <u>at least \$21 million</u> for this project that will provide access to the best imaging equipment available, right here at home. The Diagnostic Center will be promoted by UCSF to their patients as the place for imgaging and diagnostic work in the north bay, with \$1.5 million in additional operating revenue projected for SVH. "Stroke certification is part of our commitment to provide the highest quality of care to our community," said Kelly Mather, CEO of Sonoma Valley Hospital. "We know there is a short window of just a few hours that are critical in treating strokes, and patients who believe they have had a stroke can access that care in our emergency department at any time of the day or night."

In the United States, on average, a stroke is suffered once every 40 seconds; it is the fifth major cause of death and a leading cause of disability in adults, according to the American Stroke Association and the American Heart Association.
