

Yves de Balmann is an Executive Partner at Bridge Growth Partners (BGP), a private equity firm based in NY.

From 2002 to 2012, Mr. de Balmann was Co-Chief Executive Officer of Bregal Investments, a private equity firm with a global presence which he started and ran until his retirement at the end of 2012. Bregal Investments now manages over \$18 billion of invested capital.

From 1999 to 2001, Mr. de Balmann was Co-Head of Deutsche Bank's Global Investment Bank (GIB) and a member of the Board of the Bank's Global Corporates and Institutions Division. As co-head of GIB, He also oversaw the firm's private equity and venture capital investments. In addition, he was Co-Chairman and Co-CEO of Deutsche Banc Alex. Brown.

Prior to the merger of Bankers Trust with Deutsche Bank in 1999, Mr. de Balmann was a Vice-Chairman of Bankers Trust and Head of its Investment Bank. Mr. de Balmann was at Bankers Trust from 1988 to 1999.

Mr. de Balmann started his banking career at Citibank in 1973. He eventually ran its Derivatives and Proprietary Trading business in North America. He left Citibank in 1987.

Mr. de Balmann received a Master of Science in Operations Research from Stanford University in 1970 (where he was a Fulbright scholar), and an Engineering degree from the Ecole Polytechnique in Paris. He is a Director of Exelon Corporation (Nasdaq: EXC), ESI (Euronext: ESI-PA), Finalsité (a private company owned by BGP). He holds a dual U.S. and French citizenship.

Mr. de Balmann and his wife Constance moved to Sonoma from NY City in 2014. They are Founding Members of Sweetwater Spectrum, a not-for-profit organization providing housing and a "Life with Purpose" to 16 autistic adults in Sonoma. Sweetwater Spectrum now helps other families throughout the US in establishing similar facilities to the one successfully created in Sonoma.
